### ■ Motomachi Skatepark

This special skateboarding area for beginner to intermediate-level skaters is one of the largest in the prefecture. Skaters can enjoy various movable objects such as jump ramps and boxes.

### ■ Pride of Hiroshima

This special exhibit held during the G7 Summit in Hiroshima has been reorganized for permanent public exhibition. It consists of six rooms where you can experience spaces, videos, and music based on the theme "Hiroshima's path to recovery, the resplendent present, and dreams for the future."

### 360-Degree Virtual Park

Walk through this virtual park for a 360-degree view of the facilities, plants and trees, and shops in the park.

## Hiroshima Stadium Park

### ■ Hiroshima Soccer Museum and Official Store

This museum shows you the history and excitement of Hiroshima soccer, and even provides hands-on soccer experiences. The store features not only Hiroshima Sanfrece branded items but also specialty products of Hiroshima.

### ■ kiond Hiroshima

This facility features a children's playground where they can play freely on wooden equipment, a library cafe, a fair with wooden stalls to enjoy old-fashioned games, and various other ways for both children and adults to enjoy trees and wood.

### ■ Bene-Tre Hiroshima

This "space to prepare your mind and body" was created to allow you to spend your daily life as you like. The complex consists of a fitness center, library lounge, and sauna.

### ■ THE BBQ GARDEN in HIROSHIMA

This shop provides rental barbecue equipment for indoor and outdoor barbecuing in a beautiful location next to the river. You can also order ingredients in order to easily enjoy barbecuing without having to supply anything yourself. (You can also bring your own ingredients and drinks.)

### ■ Beside Hiroshima by Utsuwa

Enjoy stand-up paddleboarding in the center of Hiroshima City. Boarders are always accompanied by an instructor, making it perfect for beginners to try without worry.

## Hiroshima Castle Sannomaru

### ■ Hiroshima Castle Sharaku

This miniature Japanese archery range, one of only a few in the country, allows you to try Japanese archery (target shooting) on a real traditional "Yaba" style range. It also features lectures by experienced archery experts.

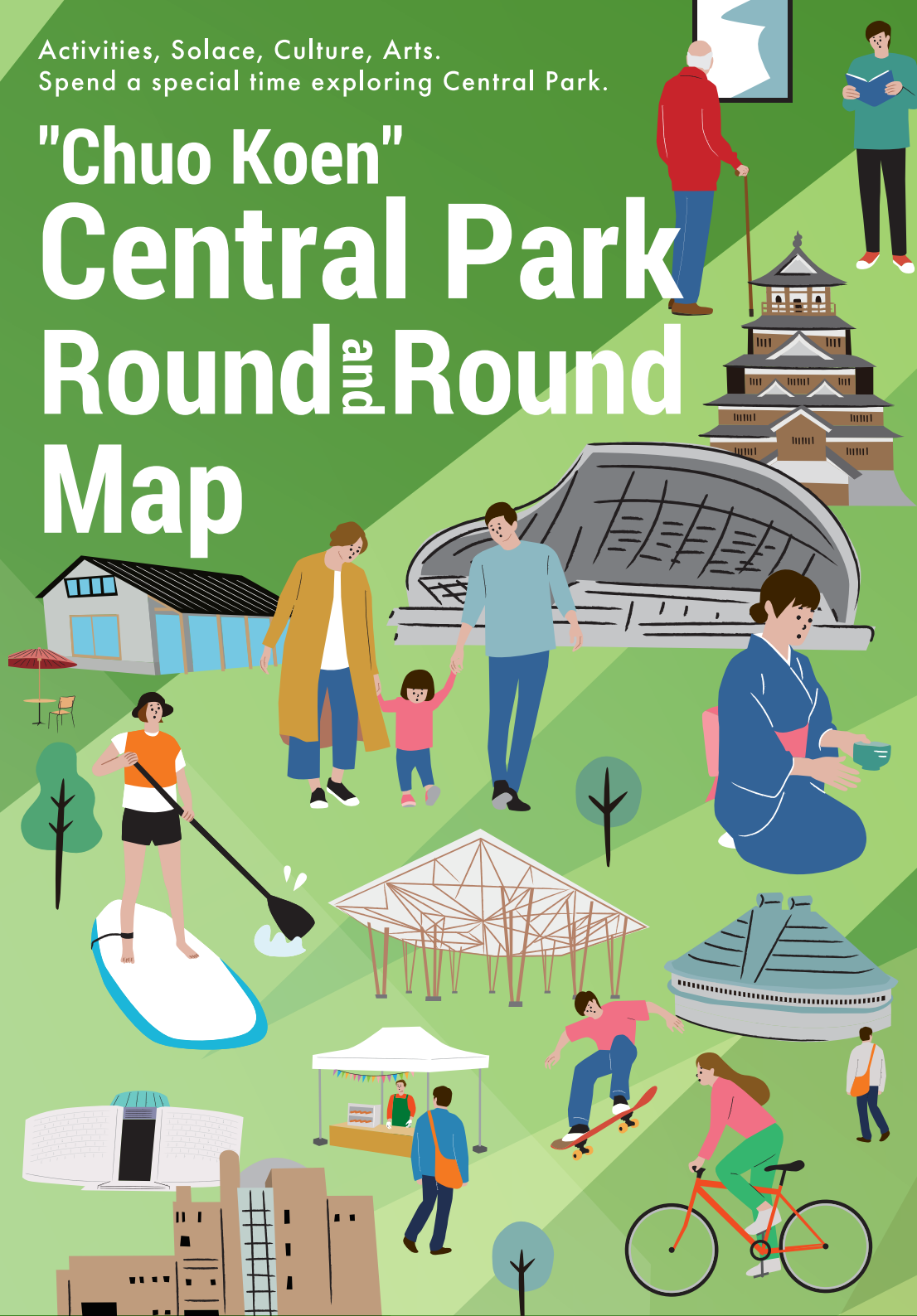

## EDION PEACE WING HIROSHIMA

This soccer stadium is home to the Sanfrecce Hiroshima team. As the first urban interactive stadium in Japan, it features a field view terrace open for free to the general public on days when there are no games or other events! (Open from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm)

## Hiroshima Stadium Park

This park, which has both bustling and peaceful areas, consists of the "Lawn Plaza" on the east side of the Edion Peace Wing Hiroshima stadium, the "River Plaza" along the Kyu-Otagawa River on the west side, and the "HiroPa" area of shops and restaurants. You can enjoy various activities and experiences along the river that use nature as well as foods and culture that are unique to Hiroshima.

## Hiroshima Prefectural Sports Center (Hiroshima Green Arena)

Sports facility within a lush green city park. This arena with a capacity of some 10,000 spectators is the largest in the Chugoku and Shikoku regions, and also includes various facilities such as a small arena, martial arts hall, archery range, indoor pool, and training room.

## 5-Days Children's Museum / Planetarium

This facility mainly consists of participatory hands-on permanent exhibits and a planetarium, and also holds events including science shows, science and creative arts workshops, and fun crafts workshops every weekend.

## Hiroshima Castle

Construction on this famous castle was started by Mori Terumoto in 1589. It is also called "Rijo (Carp) Castle." The castle tower was rebuilt in 1958 using reinforced concrete to serve as a symbol of the city's recovery after the atomic bomb.

## Hiroshima Gate Park

This bustling spot was founded as a municipal park on the location of the old Hiroshima Municipal Stadium. This central event space of Hiroshima holds various events both large and small all year round such as food festivals and market fairs.

## Hiroshima Castle Sannomaru

Located near the castle tower, this bustling new spot not only lets you experience Hiroshima's history and culture but also features restaurants to enjoy Hiroshima and Japanese food, stores where you can have first-hand experience of Japanese culture such as tea ceremony and archery, and numerous gift shops filled with treasures of Hiroshima!

## Hiroshima Museum of Art

In addition to special exhibits held periodically, this museum also features a must-see permanent exhibit of some 80 pieces from its collection that consists of French modern art with a focus on Impressionists such as Millet, Monet, Renoir, Van Gogh, Matisse, and Picasso, as well as Japanese western-style and Japanese-style paintings.

### 1 Axis of Peace

This "South-North Axis" that is seen when looking at the Atomic Bomb Dome through the Memorial Cenotaph for the Atomic Bomb Victims is based on a concept of Kenzo Tange, the architect who designed the Memorial Cenotaph and Peace Memorial Park, and his team.

### 2 Promenade of Culture

In 1978, this path was set as a walking course on the route heading west on Jonan-dori Avenue from Hiroshima Station through Shukkeien Garden, Hiroshima Prefectural Art Museum, and Hiroshima Castle to Peace Memorial Park. Metal plates engraved with the "Promenade of Culture" are embedded on the path.

### 3 Sundial (In Hannover Garden)

Enjoy the leisurely flow of time amid nature.

### 4 Wall Art of Underground Passageway

The artists group "OVER ALLs" created wall art along some 70 m of the underground passageway between the Pacela shopping center and the Stadium Park.

### 5 Motomachi Poplar Tree

With plans to use it for open-air movie screenings and other events, this poplar tree is a symbol of growing civic activities. Currently the third generation.

### 6 Cherry Trees along Honkawa River

A great spot for cherry blossom viewing along the river in the spring.

### 7 Home Base and Pitcher's Plate

This monument is embedded in the original locations of the base and plate of the old baseball stadium.

### 8 Second Generation Peace Bell

The current second-generation "Peace Bell" was rung at the Third Peace Festival (Peace Memorial Ceremony) held in 1949.

### 9 Peace Wall

This giant mural, with a width of 8 m 62 cm and height of 2 m, was specially created by Yoichi Takahashi, a writer of the popular manga Captain Tsubasa.

### 10 Stone Wall of Hiroshima Castle

You can actually see and feel the history of the castle since its construction to present day through the affixed oyster shells and engravings from the Fukushima-Masanori period. Maybe you can find some traces of history on this stone wall!
